significant collection of books, manuscripts, archival collections dating from 1519,

About DRT

History

The Daughters of the Republic of Texas (DRT) is the oldest women's patriotic organization in Texas, dating to 1891. The idea of forming an association of Republic of Texas descendants was conceived in Galveston by Miss Betty Ballinger and her cousin, Miss Hally Bryan.

Early meetings were held jointly with the Texas Veterans Association. At their meeting in 1907, only six veterans were able to attend. The men recognized their increasing frailties and bequeathed their memories and their deeds as a precious legacy to be held in trust forever by The Daughters of the Republic of Texas.
